BOARD RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER US FEDERAL LAW

US federal law requires regulatory boards for all professions to report to specified federal databanks, most often the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank (HIPDB).

FCLB serves as reporting agent to HIPDB for over 30 of our US member boards, which means that US boards may report once and the data is submitted electronically to both CIN-BAD and HIPDB.

Dr Campbell will explain the details of your legal reporting requirements, including the necessity of reporting board actions within 30 days.
