Re: Letter of Intent, Alternate Director for District IV

Dear Dr. Campion, Dr. Schwartzbauer, Nominating Committee, and fellow District IV Members;

I am writing this letter to announce my candidacy for the position of District IV Alternate Director at the FCLB 2024 annual convention.

In 2022, I was the NBCE delegate for New Mexico at the FCLB conference. My participation at that conference was both stimulating and informative. I have been able to utilize the knowledge I gained to positively impact the operation of the New Mexico Board. As a result, our board has placed increased emphasis on PACE approved courses for granting CEUs and the Complaint Committee, of which I am a member, has begun to utilize EBAS in our disciplinary actions.

I attended my first District I, IV meeting in 2023. I found the session on state board dynamics, lead by the district representatives, to be particularly useful. The small group format helped to broaden my perspective on board operations and was especially conducive to building fellowship with board members from other states. Additionally, as an Advanced Practice Certified chiropractor, I can provide valuable insight into the regulatory issues unique to this group of practitioners.
